Service Projects

Metro Parks loves to involve scouts in service to the parks!

Generally, you can contact the naturalist or manager at your closest park to arrange a project for your group. (not every park has a naturalist)

Common service projects include:

- Picking up trash along waterways and in picnic areas
- Removing invasive plants
- Weeding/mulching garden beds

Please be aware that some of these activities are only practical during certain seasons. For example, garlic mustard can only be pulled for about a month in the spring (usually April)

Eagle Projects

If you know a scout who would like to work with Metro Parks to complete an Eagle project, please have him/her contact the Naturalist/Manager at their closest park.

Eagle projects vary by park, but might include:

- Benches
- Box turtle enclosure
- Signage
- Bird or bat houses
- Bird feeders
